



Constitution (to be reviewed and updated annually)

Aims

- 1) LCCP will monitor the lower River Char to identify, reduce and eventually eliminate sources of river pollution
- 2) LCCP will engage with the local community to raise awareness of the river and to identify ways to separate rainwater and wastewater at source
- 3) LCCP will engage with Wessex Water to investigate and implement nature-based treatment solutions to river pollution

How decisions are made

The organisation shall be managed by members of a Steering Group whose members will rotate key roles, including chairing and facilitating meetings, notetaking and report writing. Decision making is by consensus. If no consensus is possible a decision will be deemed to be taken with the support of four fifths of the Steering Group.

Carrying out the aims

LCCP has the power to:

- (1) raise funds, receive grants and donations
- (2) apply funds to carry out the work of the organisation
- (3) cooperate with and support other river monitoring groups with similar purposes

Money and property

A treasurer will be appointed by the Steering Group and will keep regular accounts. Two members of the Steering Group will be designated to authorise payments. Money and property must only be used for LCCP's aims.

Meetings

General meetings will be held to inform the local community and recruit volunteers to monitor the water quality of the Char. A meeting will be held annually, open to all members and volunteers, to discuss past progress, priorities for the coming year and filling vacancies in the Steering Group.
